RECOVERY COACH TRAINING

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BECOME A PEER RECOVERY COACH

This 5 day training is designed to prepare participants for employment as a Recovery Coach – individuals who are in recovery who can offer social, emotional and/or educational supportive services to help prevent relapse and promote recovery.

Participants should have an interest in providing support, mentorship, and guidance to persons with substance use disorders and co-occurring mental health disorders.

Participants should themselves be individuals in stable recovery; administrators, other service providers or other positions that will benefit from a comprehensive knowledge of Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC).

Participants will learn how to:

- Help individuals in addiction treatment gain access to needed resources, services or supports
- Help address multiple issues in their life created by their SUD – ex. Returning to employment, finding stable housing and transition through treatment
- Help sustain recovery

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• Build skills to enhance relationships
