April Highlights:

- Childhood Obesity Grant - being evaluated
- Robert Wood Johnson Grant - possible research based grant
- Tele-psychiatry is being used by the Family Medical Center and Lenawee Community Mental Health due to shortage of mental health professionals in this area
- Deaths from drug overdose have increased by 25%, and the number of suicides have tripled in 2015. LCMHA will be reinstating Suicide Prevention program.


