- 4. REVIEW: Lenawee County Homeless Numbers
  - a. # added to Housing Preference waitlist in February 2021: 6
  - b. # pulled by Housing Agent in February 2021: 0
    - i. 3 people were scheduled for briefings via phone in February. There have been no pulls since January 28<sup>th</sup>. One of these briefings was a veteran, and he moved into permanent housing on March 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - c. Community Waitlists:
    - i. Legacy Housing Apartments: Chronically homeless individuals can apply at Housing Help of Lenawee.
    - ii. Carriage House's voucher waitlist is open for some 1 bedroom and 2 bedroom units. Interested folks can apply directly at the complex.
  - d. MSHDA Homeless Veteran Report
    - i. Total number of homeless veterans identified in previous month: 0
    - ii. Number of new homeless veterans identified this month: 1
    - iii. *#* of homeless veterans housed this month: 0
    - iv. *#* of homeless veterans currently seeking housing: 1
    - v. # of homeless veterans that left services without housing: 0
- 5. Grants
  - a. CERA Funds
    - i. A detailed training was held recently regarding these funds, and we are hoping to be able to access them in the next few weeks. Here are some of the requirements (and differences compared to the Eviction Diversion Funds) to access the funds:

- 1. Recipients have to be under 80% AMI
- 2. The amount of assistance recipients can access will be capped at the amount of time they can receive funds for. Caps will also be determined by the size of a recipient's household. The less income you have, the more funds you will be eligible for.
- 3. Funds can be used for a \$300 internet stipend that will go directly to tenants.
- 4. Recipients don't have to be facing an eviction to be eligible. They can just have received notice of being behind on their rent.
- 5. Up to \$200 of funds can be used to pay late fees.
- 6. Landlords won't be required to forgive a portion of rent owed to participate.
- 7. These funds are only for renters and cannot be used for mortgage assistance. Community Action Agency (CAA) may have some funding to assist with mortgage payments. They also offer mortgage counseling.
- ii. Housing Help will manage rental payments and CAA will handle utilities. All clients should begin their process at Housing Help, regardless of their need. We have a short amount of time to spend a lot of money, and are just waiting for the governor's office to officially sign off on things before we can get started!
- b. Community Foundation
  - i. Contact them to apply
- 6. Overview of Services from USDA's Rural Development Team
  - a. Cheryl Holm and Hailey Hartig are here to present about rural development resources available to us through by the USDA. The highlights include:
    - i. From 2015-2020, they've invested \$130 million in Lenawee County, primarily in housing
    - ii. 3 Single Family Housing Programs
    - iii. Single Family Home Loans and Repair Programs
    - iv. Community Facilities Loans
    - v. Water and Waste Disposal Loans and Grants
    - vi. Utilities Programs
    - vii. Business and Industry Loans

- 7. Sub-Committee Reports
  - a. Public Awareness
    - i. On hiatus after Project Connect. They will schedule a meeting before our next CoC meeting to start working on their next project, likely Case By Case.
  - b. Homeless Youth
    - i. No updates. The group is currently working with one youth. LUXE is still available at Goodwill. Their primary focus right now is encouraging youth to go to school.
  - c. Affordable Housing/Short-Term Emergency Shelter
    - i. No updates. They will schedule a meeting before our next CoC meeting. There is some potential to collaborate and connect with the Human Relations Commission and the Kalamazoo CoC. Elizabeth will attend their next meeting (3/26 @ 6:00pm)

  - a. LCMHA Next month will be launching MyStrength, a mobile and web based application for wellness, using evidence based strategies and modules to improve behavioral and physical health.
