Frank Nagle called the meeting to order at 8:05 a.m. and conducted roll call.

Agenda Review – No additions requested to the agenda

LHN Leadership Updates:

Collective Impact Core

Building a Trauma Informed Community

- ACEs training is getting scheduled in Brooklyn in the near future. ACEs trainings cannot be conducted virtually.

2020 Census

- Frank will reach out to Clint for a status update on the Lenawee 2020 Census. It is reported by participants that Lenawee was at least at 56% completion in recent reports.

COVID-19

- Catholic Charities (Sue Lewis) asks how other agencies/organizations are planning and preparing to re-open. Dialogue ensued related to entry point temperature screenings, logging, and action items for various scenarios. Frank will provide CDC masking and re-opening guideline documents in the follow-up email for participants to reference.

- Family Medical Center shared they are screening everyone at their entrance. Everyone is required to wear a mask. They have transitioned many aspects of care to telemedicine platforms.
- Community Mental Health shares they have installed Plexiglas barriers in locations where 6 feet distances is not possible.
- Participants requested the LHN check to see what the Lenawee Health Department's guidance is for re-opening and precautions to implement to ensure the safety of staff and the community.
- It was brainstormed if a separate meeting is needed for agencies/organizations to network and share how they are reopening.

Quality of Life for Older Adults:

Department on Aging provided an update that they do have SOME masks for older adults. If someone is in need, they will provide a mask if supply on hand permits. Operationally, they are phasing back into providing personal and respite care in a safe and healthy manner. They are hopeful the Senior Lifestyle Expo will take place in September.

Region 2 Area Agency on Aging shared information on GetSetUp.com. This resource provides virtual classes (for a fee) to individuals wanting to learn about virtual capabilities and how they function. Region 2 is scheduling their first virtual Diabetes PATH cohort in June.

disAbility Connections shared that it is important for our community to find ways to provide resources and support to families and caregivers. This population is experiencing a higher level of care demands and are likely in need of support themselves.

Opioid Addiction and Abuse:

HRSA RCORP Planning – Lenawee Opioid Response Project

- Final sustainability planning session to occur June 3, 2020. The project has been extended through November 30, 2020, with flexibility to establish a project end date prior if that is best suited for the community and project.

HRSA RCORP Implementation Grant NOFO

- Application is near completion and will be submitted by May 22, 2020. If awarded, this grant will provide \$1,000,000 of grant funds spread over three years of project implementation. All final documents will be submitted to the LHN Google Drive Grants folder.

April Drug Take Back Day

- The Drug Take Back Day scheduled for April 25, 2020 is cancelled due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Please share with your agency, consumers, and coalitions.

Overweight and Obesity Incidence:

MDHHS 4x4 SPAN – Physical Activity Grant

- Presently working with community stakeholders to identify the feasibility of formulating a meeting comprised of the many groups currently working in or allocating resources toward non-motorized/activity friendly interventions.

Food Access

- Application has been submitted to Michigan Health Endowment Fund to scale nutrition and healthy lifestyles education and workshops in Lenawee County. This will include a gardening, Social Determinants of Health, Education, and food access components. This is a two year grant awarding just

over \$300,000 for nutrition and healthy lifestyles interventions. All final documents will be uploaded to the LHN Google Drive Grants folder.

Events/Health Screenings

- United Way of Monroe and Lenawee reports that the April Health Check Event is cancelled.
- Opportunity exists for the LHN to disseminate educational resources about self-monitoring chronic conditions during the COVID-19 outbreak.
