- Madeline DeMarco shared that she wrote an article in the Daily Telegram about the 2020 Lenawee Community Health Assessment and the survey process. If people have questions, they can also be referred to the Daily Telegram article.
- Sue Lewis expressed the importance of additional local data sources to support the development of the LHN Community Health Improvement Plan. Community Action Agency did an Assessment in 2019.
- LHN Leadership will develop a CHIP folder with resources for participants and members to review prior to the CHIP development meetings.

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion:

- Healthy People 2020 defines disparities as "a particular type of health difference that is closely linked with social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantage. Health Disparities adversely affect groups of people who have systematically experienced greater obstacles to health based on their racial or ethnic group; socioeconomic status; gender; age; mental health; cognitive, sensory, or physical disability; sexual orientation or gender identity; geographic location; or other characteristics historically linked to discrimination or exclusion."
- It is important for the LHN to understand the disproportionate effect of disparities on populations residing in Lenawee in order to address health equity. We must understand which Zip-Codes and demographics are most affected to be able to allocate resources and efforts accordingly.
- Healthy People 2020 defines Health Equity as "attainment of the highest level of health for all people. Achieving health equity requires valuing everyone equally with focused and ongoing societal efforts to address avoidable inequalities, historical and contemporary injustices, and elimination of health and health care disparities."
