## **Quality of Life for Older Adults**

### Department on Aging – Cari Rebottaro provided the following update(s):

- Senior Centers continue to offer curbside meals to anyone over the age of 60. Conversations have started with centers to review winter operations given coronavirus implications & restrictions. Department on Aging is analyzing how to offer resources in colder months and aligned with COVID-19 precautions.

### Region 2 Area Agency on Aging – Martha York provided the following update(s):

- Is developing collaborations with other Area Agencies on Aging to broaden their offerings of virtual classes & resources for communities. This includes PATH and Caregiver programs. AAA's provide technical assistance to older adults in utilizing or gaining access to technology.

## **Reducing Substance/Opioid Use**

### Habitat for Humanity & A3 Resident Coalition – De'Angelo Boone provided the following update(s):

- Residents have shared they have experienced substance use, opioid use, and recovery challenges. There is consideration to start a support group in East Adrian for residents. Linkages to the Lenawee Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition are available to support.

### Catholic Charities of Jackson, Hillsdale and Lenawee Counties – Sue Lewis provided the following update(s):

- Attended HRSA Rural health webinars regarding the value of faith-based intervention with substance use and opioid use disorders. Shared there is an intersection between the faith community and recovery. It was conceptualized as an opportunity for the LSAPC & LHN to connect with the faith-based community for further collaboration.

### One Lenawee – Dave Maxwell provided the following update(s)

- Expressed interest in knowing how Pathways Engagement Center is doing. Referenced the Morning Rotary's support toward opening the facility and interest to know how well the location is connecting with residents in need of resources, support, and care coordination.

### ProMedica Charles and Virginia Hickman Hospital - Frank Nagle provided the following update(s):

- HRSA RCORP Planning grant closes 11/30/2020. No other deliverables are due for this project.

- City Refuge continues their food pantry and food delivery. The pantry is available to anyone however; delivery is available within the Adrian City limits.
- Fresh Food Distributions are available the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month from 1-3 pm in the St. Mary's Piety Center. Served 196 families/households in the last session.

### United Way of Monroe & Lenawee Counties – Laura Pips provided the following update(s):

- Health Checks are tentatively scheduled in April & October of 2021, pending COVID restrictions. United Way is open to any suggestions regarding how to operate a health-screening event in accordance with COVID precautions.
