Recognition: Dave recognized Chris Miller for his many contributions to the City of Adrian. Many thanks Chris from all the One Lenawee group! Chris will remain a member of the OL Steering Committee.

One Lenawee Strategic Vision Priorities 2020 and Beyond:

Public Transportation:

- **Non-motorized (active)** The Kiwanis Trail will be expanded in the Spring with the paving alongside of Raisin Center Highway. Marty reported that the application and accompanying paperwork for the grant has been completed and filed. All was approved by the County Commission. This is a huge accomplishment with connecting Adrian and Tecumseh!
- **Motorized** The Transportation Task Force is trying to get funding for the navigator position. The National Foundation Science Project/Blue Space/First Student has been delayed due to a combination of factors regarding autonomous transportation. It may not move forward at all especially with Chris Miller's departure.

Community Capital:

• Chris reported similar information regarding Community Capital from our previous two meetings.

Communication:

• The Telegram will accept an article if we submit it. Marty will submit an article soon regarding the county perspective in coming out of Covid-19.

- WLEN OL will be on September 19th.
- Regarding Visit Lenawee they'll post any impact stories on their web site that we submit.

Priority Groups:

Cradle to Career – Mark reported that the 2019 Community Report Card is on their web site. Various groups are coming together to take a new look at school readiness, especially for the 1-5year-old age group and how to prepare kids to start school. C2C is also looking at a soft skill certification which may be pleasing for employers. Tim presented a summary of the LCAN survey results.

Lenawee Health Network – The network is currently focused on the planning of the 2020 Lenawee County Health Assessment. Sue would like to look at changing one of the Community Health and Safety objectives for this priority group to better fit with the OL priority area of non-motorized transportation as it connects with the social determinants of health.

Marketing and Communication - New brochures for the Kiwanis Trail are now available.

Entrepreneurship – Lenawee County is eligible for funding for small businesses impacted by Covid. The application is available on the MEDC web site. The maximum award is \$20,000 and due date is August 5th.

Arts/Placemaking – Don reported that the Art-a-licious committee is working with the First Friday Committee for a possible event in September.
