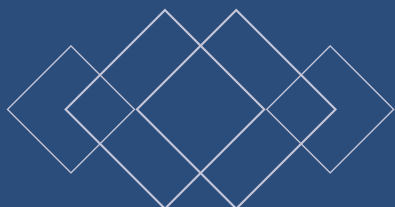
Access to Services

Interconnections Inc. Drop In Center

Interconnections Inc. Drop in Center is a safe place for people who have a mental illness or substance use disorder, or experienced one in the past. All staff are Certified Peer Support Specialists.

Anyone in the community over the age of 18 years is welcome at the Center and there is no charge for any services. The Drop in Center offers groups, community resources, and general support from staff. The center is open daily from noon to 6pm.

Pathways Engagement Center

Pathways Engagement Center is a welcoming and safe place for anyone who needs help with substance use. At Pathways, anyone can find resources, support, and advocacy. Pathways offers this help when other businesses are closed.

Pathways is open daily from 8pm to 8am. Pathways staff are Peer Recovery Coaches who are in long-term recovery themselves.

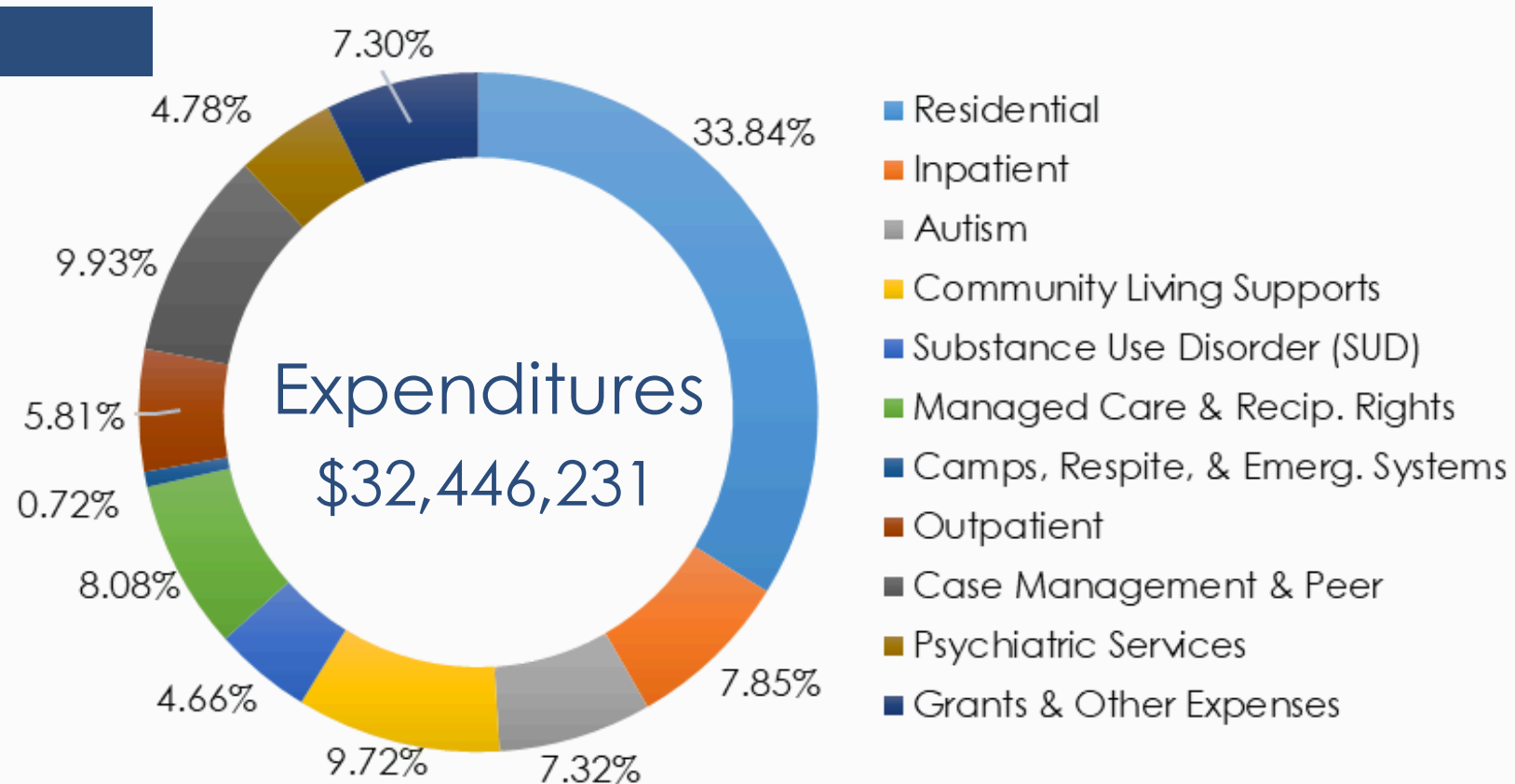
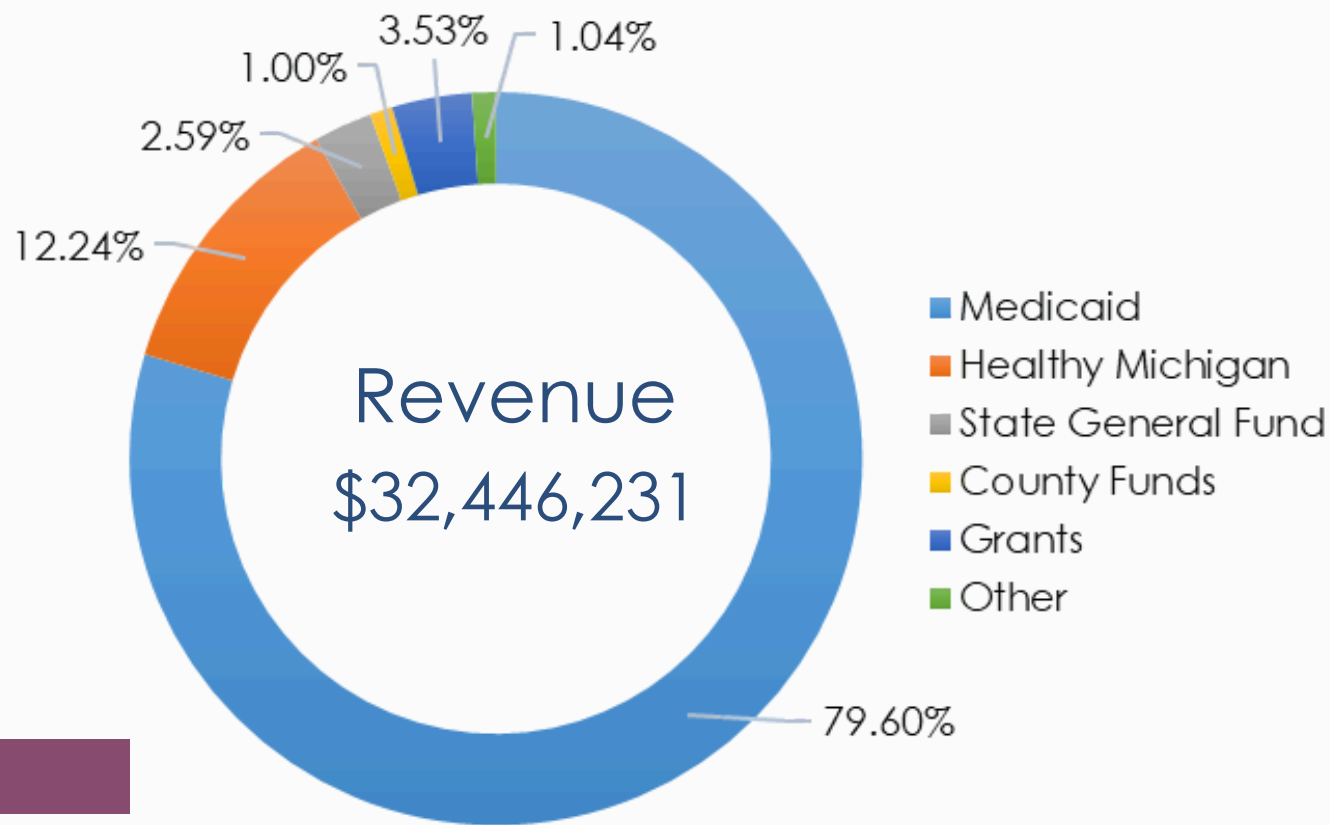

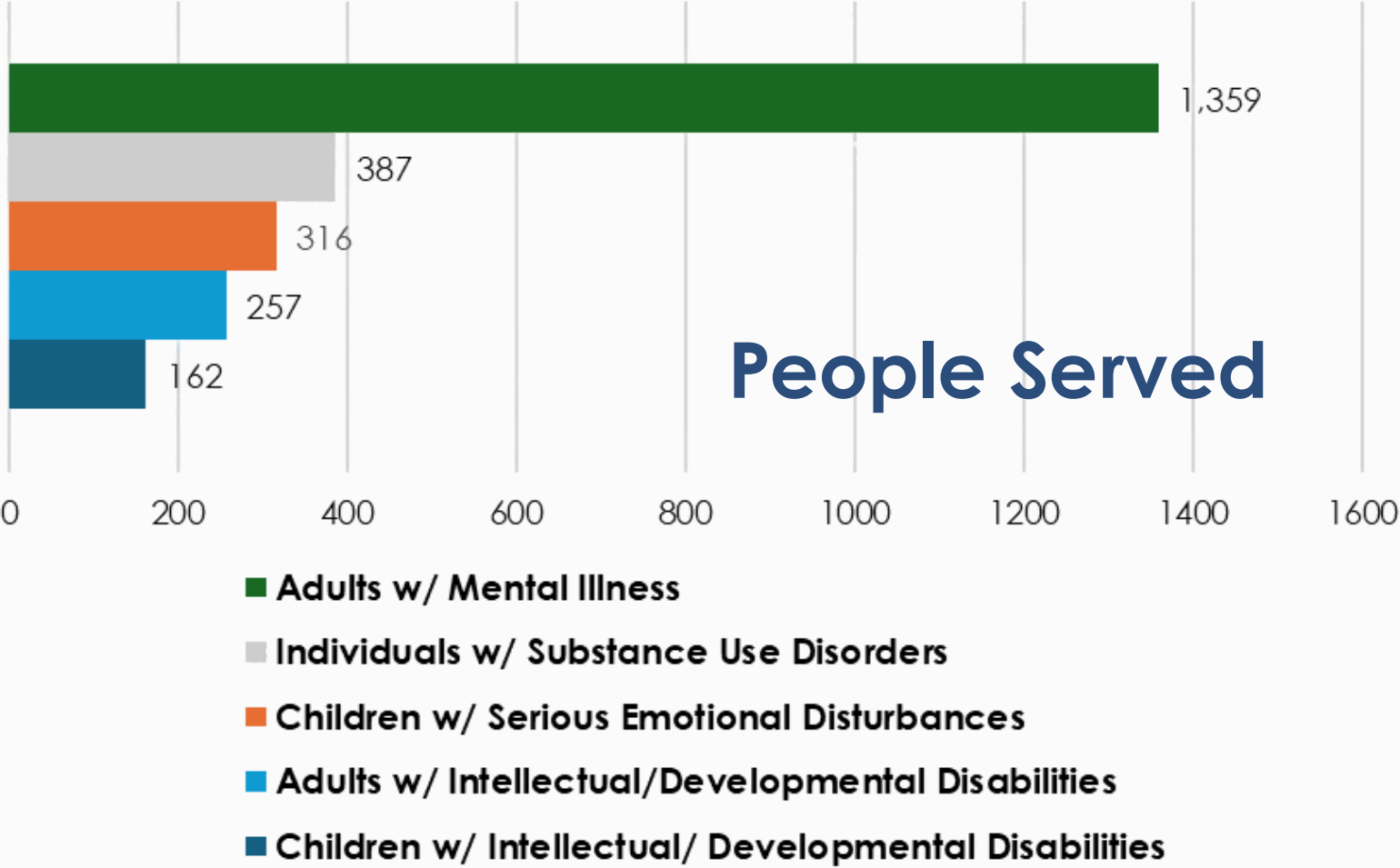
